Camp Rules

5. Don't leave the camp site without permission.
6. Don't disturb other campers in the next field.

8. No knives other than those used for eating are permitted on camp. If you have any other knife or buy one, then leave it with an officer for safe keeping.
9. Enjoy yourself and keep smiling even when it rains
10. Don't go down to the stream alone or swim in it without an officer present.
